



## TSBV Pendragon

### Tasks Policy 2022 - 2023

1. Every competition-playing member (hereinafter referred to as: member) must be able to whistle at least at level BS2 (former F-level).
2. If a member does not possess a valid referee diploma (minimum BS2 or F), he/she is obliged to obtain it as yet. At the beginning of each season, a referee course will be organized by TSBV Pendragon (hereinafter referred to as: association). Participation in this course is compulsory. If a member fails to attend the course or completes the course without success, the member will be excluded from the competition. In the event that there are compelling reasons not to participate in the course, an exception may be made to the above rule. A request for such an exception must be submitted by e-mail to the SKP in good time, but 48 hours before the start of the course.
3. Every member, including new members, is expected to be able to perform all table tasks (scorer, timer and 24-second operator). At the beginning of each season, a table course will be organised by the association where everyone can gain the necessary knowledge to perform all table tasks. If the course has not been used, a member is responsible for possessing the appropriate knowledge.
4. When making the task schedule, the matches of the team for which a member is selected. Matches of any second team will not be taken into account. The division of tasks is final as soon as the SKP has sent the task schedule to the members. Each member is then responsible for the task assigned to him/her.
5. If a member cannot perform a task, he/she has the responsibility to arrange replacement for the task. A member remains responsible for a task until he/she submits a takeover request via email to the SKP'er. The takeover is final when authorized by the SKP'er. After giving this consent, responsibility for the task shifts to the replacement.

6. All members should make a proportional commitment to the proper functioning of the association. For this purpose A points system shall be used to keep the distribution of tasks as fair as possible. Points will be awarded to all tasks performed for the association. Board members, coaches and registered referees are exempt from tasks. Participation in committees also earns points. The SKP person supervises the distribution and execution of tasks and ensures that it is as proportional as possible.

7. A member can obtain double points if he/she performs a task at the last minute (crisis task). The SKP'er or usher will clearly indicate when this is the case.

8. Twice a season, a points table will appear in the club magazine de Flodder, showing who has done what and how many points a member has obtained. In addition, the overview can be seen at all times at the SKP'er.

9. The SKP point system:

- Table Tasks: 2 points
- Referee home game: 3 punten
- Referee Away Game (BS4 level): 5 punten
- Committee/ Active Member (kas, PR, AA, Flodder, TC): 5 punten
- IT Committee: 10 punten

10. **Sanctions for neglect of duties**

- **Home Off**

1st time failing:

20 euro

The fine imposed by the federation (but at least 10 euros) and 20 euros

- **Cancellation for 2nd time**

30 euros and 1 match suspension

Fine imposed by the federation (but minimum 10 euros) and 30 euros and 1 match suspension

- **Cancellation for 3rd time**

40 euros and permanent suspension

The fine imposed by the association (but minimum 10 euros) and 40 euros and permanent suspension

After a fine is imposed for forfeiting a task, the member may not play matches again until the fine has been paid. Of course, the task does not lapse. In a subsequent schedule, the task must be made up to maintain proportionality. Forfeiting in order to have to do fewer tasks that way **does not work.**

11. If a member does not show up to a task, the coach of his/her team will be informed and informed of the sanctions for the member concerned.

12. The tasks policy should be clear to everyone who becomes a member of TSBV Pendragon. That way, members will not be surprised and know what obligations are involved in playing at TSBV Pendragon. To make the rules in the tasks policy known to the entire association, they are published on the website and placed in the first Flodder of the season.
